**Punctuality** 

Along with our drive to improve attendance we are also looking closely at punctuality. We need children to be in school on time so that they do not miss vital learning. The school day starts at 10 to 9 (8.50am), We also expect that parents/carers will collect their children on time.

If you are going to be late to collect your child, please phone the school office to let us know. If you arrive late and have not called, staff will ask you (or the person collecting your child) why you are late.

## Parents' Evenings

Parents' Evenings are coming up before October half term. The dates are 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> October from 3.30pm - 6.00pm. A separate letter has been sent out and we ask parent/carers to return it as soon as possible. We will do our best to accommodate parent/carer choices. Appointments are 10 minutes per child and this is an opportunity for your child's teacher to show you what he/she is doing well and where improvements need to be made. There will be our usual Community Fair running at the same time as Parents' Evening so we ask parents to enter and exit school via the hall and spend a few moments looking at each stall to find out what services are available in the community. There will also be a parent voice survey (which will only take a few moments to complete). Families that complete the survey will be entered into a raffle with the chance to win a food hamper packed with goodies and treats.
