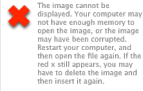
Under 17s swim for free

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Stay 2 metres away from other people when bringing your child through the school grounds.



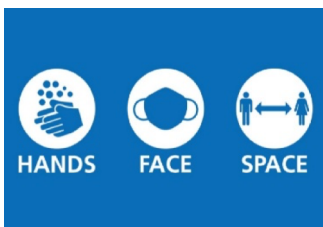
Just ONE adult at drop off and pick up times.
