

Home Learning Ideas

Maths-

Counting hunt

- Can you find 5 objects in your house?
 - Can you find 10 objects in your house? Can you challenge yourself and find 20 objects?
- Make sure you count to check you have the right amount!

Number walk

- What numbers do you recognise in your home? Can you then compare the numbers using the new symbols? <, >, and = ? Remember, the crocodile always eats the largest number!
- Can you write all the numbers that you can see in your house? Remember to say the number formation rhymes as you write them down to make sure that you are forming the numbers correctly.

Shape hunt

- What shapes can you find in your home?
- How many of each shape do you have?
- Can you sort shapes into groups that you can find in your house?

English

- Keep a brief diary of your time off - draw a picture and write one simple sentence a day. (Remember to use your finger spaces and capital letters!)
- Make some labels for things around your house, don't forget to use your Fred fingers to help you!
- Practise writing some red words which you have learnt in phonics - (my, the, she, he and to)
- Can you use those red words to make a simple sentence - She went to the shop.
- Can you read a traditional tale and have a go at retelling the story in the correct order?

Topic/ Science

- Can you draw the 5 senses?
- Senses walk around your home - Draw/Write what can you see, hear, smell, taste and touch.
- Be a taste detective! Pick some different foods that you have in your house and taste them - describe what you can taste.
- Can you draw what you can see in your home?
- With your adult at home close your eyes and using your sense of hearing, describe what you can hear.
- Place some objects in a bag, using your sense of touch can you describe what you feel? Draw a picture of what you think it might be!
